Interest in vegan living is at an all-time high, as more and more people are leaving animal-derived foods off their plates – for animals, the environment, and their own health. This shift in public consciousness has restaurant chains and supermarkets around the world scrambling to meet the growing demand for plant-based options. If the restaurant switched to a fully vegan menu, it would be an exciting new start for Hotel Carmen and great for business.

Taking meat, eggs, and dairy products off the menu would likely increase the number of visitors to your establishment and also spare many animals a life of suffering and a violent death. We hope you'll choose to bypass this whole ugly business and recoup the cost of the unpaid bill by agreeing to serve your customers only delicious vegan foods that don't cost animals their lives -a win for both animals and Hotel Carmen.
