While the theory of evolution is Darwin's legacy, many people don't know that this groundbreaking theory laid much of the foundation for modern animal rights, changing our perception of other animals and illuminating the fact that humans are animals. Darwin introduced selfaggrandising humans to the idea that our species shares a common ancestry with all forms of life - that we are, in fact, one ape among many, part of the great orchestra of life on Earth. It is because of Darwin's research that people started to realise that other animals are like us in all the ways that matter - we all feel pain, engage in play, parent, and experience emotions such as joy, love, loneliness, and fear.
