I wonder how you sleep at night, given TUI's dubious distinction of being the UK's last major travel provider to sell tickets to watery prisons that hold marine animals captive. Thanks to your company's greed, orcas and other dolphins at *abuse*ment parks such as SeaWorld never experience what it is like to *Live Happy*.

There's a good reason that your competitors have washed their hands of these hellholes. In their vast ocean homes, marine mammals swim far, dive deep, and socialise. Orca calves learn natural behaviours from their elders and pass them on to their young, and bottlenose dolphins, who possess a strong sense of self and the ability to consider the future, employ problem-solving to thrive.

At marine parks, these intelligent individuals are confined to cramped cement tanks where they suffer physically and psychologically.
